LEGISLATIVE YOUTH ADVISORY COUNCIL ANNOUNCES 2017-2018 MEMBERSHIP

OUTSTANDING STUDENTS TO HAVE OPPORTUNITY TO INFLUENCE THE FUTURE OF THE STATE

Some of Louisiana's most outstanding students have been selected as new members of the Louisiana Legislative Youth Advisory Council (LYAC) and will work together over the next year in an effort to influence the legislative process and make the state a better place for young people. A new council is selected annually and is composed entirely of students to addresses issues affecting the youth of Louisiana. It is overseen by the Louisiana Commission on Civic Education.

Now in its tenth year, LYAC facilitates the communication between youth and the legislature and gives students the unique opportunity to be involved in the workings of state government. LYAC members will have the opportunity to study and address issues of importance to young people, including education, employment, youth health and physical fitness, strategies to increase youth participation in local and state government, underage drinking, litter and environmental control, youth access to state and local services, and various other issues.

The 31 members of the council are selected from a large pool of applicants from around the state who display a strong interest in civic involvement. Three student members serve from each of the congressional districts and the remainder serve at-large. The members must be in grades nine through twelve and enrolled in a public or private high school or participating in a home study program.
